

❖1935: Inauguration as Indian Institute of Medical Research at 41, Dharmatala Street, Calcutta

❖1937: Visit by Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru

❖1938: Moved to New Location: P27 Princep Street, Calcutta

❖1941: Publication of New Journal "Annals of Biochemistry and Experimental Medicine" as a medium for rapid communication of original papers in Biological Sciences.

❖1956: Name changed to Indian Institute for Biochemistry & Experimental Medicine. Came under the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR) – as a chain of the National Laboratories established by the Govt. of India.

❖1964: Moved to the present location at Jadavpur, Kolkata. World Health Organization (WHO) identified this institute as the International Centre for Cholera Phage typing.

❖1965: Name again changed to Indian Institute of Experimental Medicine (IIEM)

❖1967: Oral vaccine against cholera tried in humans for the first time

❖1982: The Institute was renamed as Indian Institute of Chemical Biology (IICB)

❖1988: UNDP funded major program to study biology of Leishmania parasites started

❖2001: Poly herbal preparation, "ASMON", launched for clinical use for treatment of Asthma.

❖2006: Initiation of the establishment of 2<sup>nd</sup> Campus of CSIR-IICB in Salt Lake City, Kolkata

❖2015: The 2<sup>nd</sup> Campus "IICB-Translational Research Unit of Excellence (TRUE) at Sector V Salt Lake, Kolkata 700091, was inaugurated by the Hon'ble Minister of Science & Technology Dr. Harshwardan in the presence of other dignitaries.
